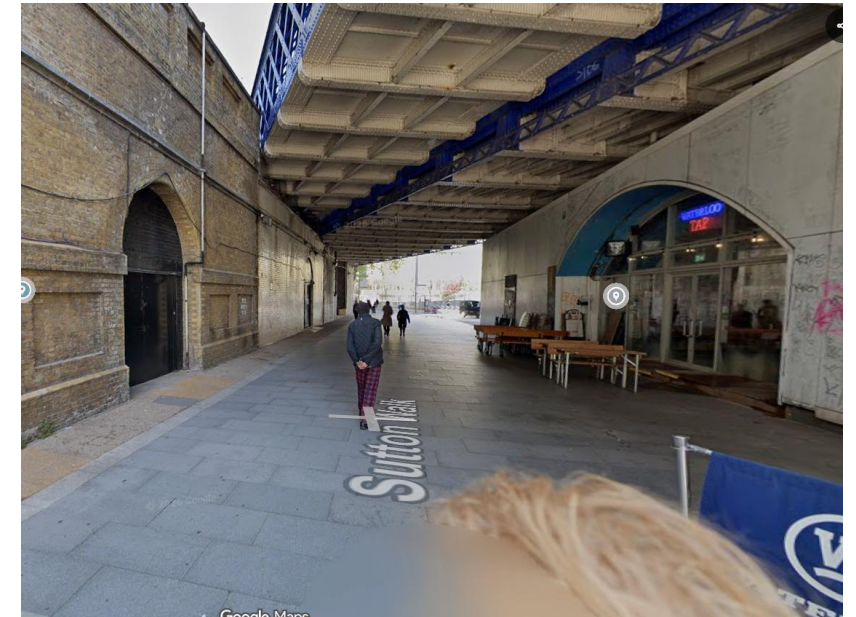
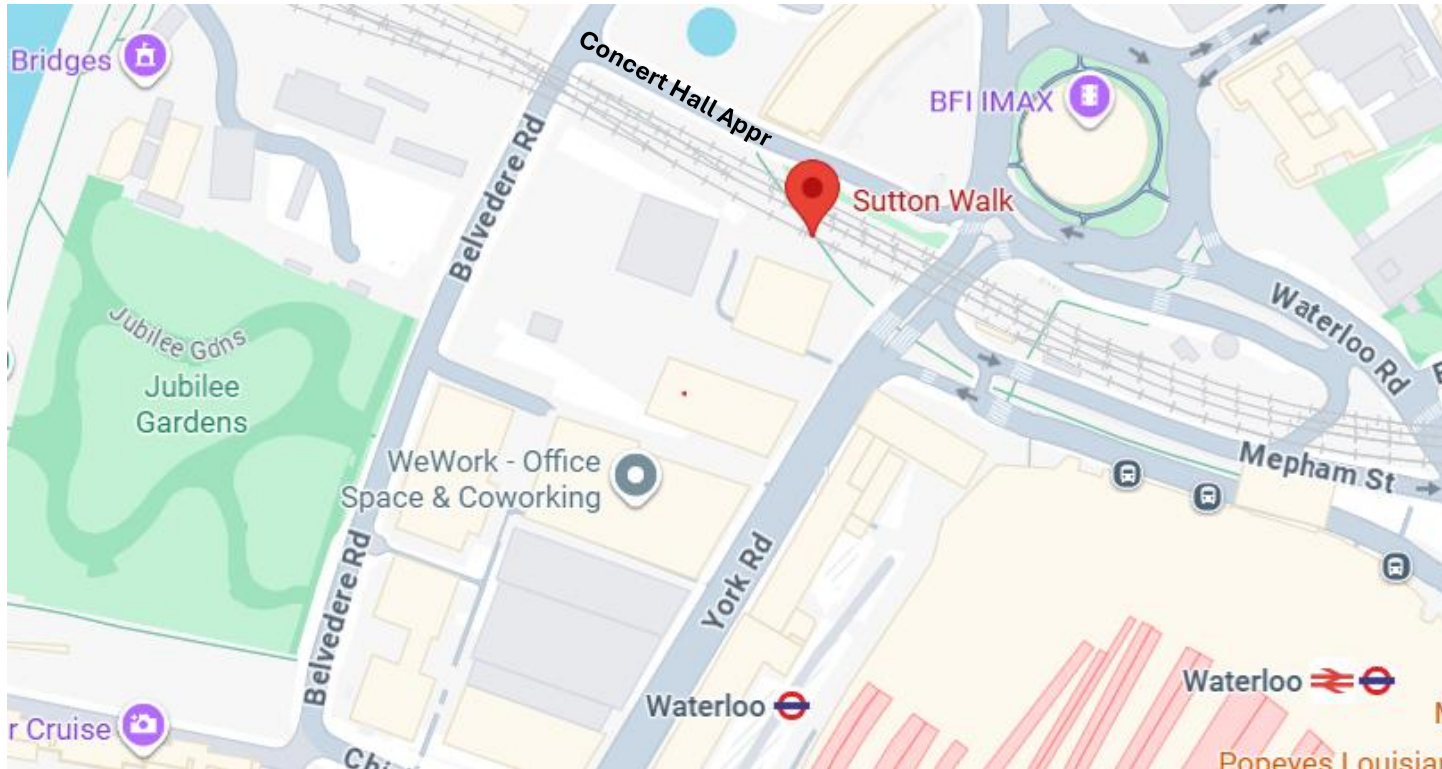
Introduction

- Painting under the name My Dog Sighs, I am a leading contemporary street artist who has spent more than 20 years honing my craft on streets across the globe.
- I am known for melancholic, naïve portraiture on found materials such as abandoned food cans, and for my signature painted eyes reflecting the human condition.
- I have delivered major museum commissions, headlined major events, collaborated with artists including The Who and Fatboy Slim, appeared on educational syllabuses, given a TED talk, and been featured widely in global media, with The Guardian naming me a “British street artist you should know.”
- My work is inspired by the world around me. I incorporate influences from my travels within site specific work and reinterpret these stimuli to inform new bodies of work.



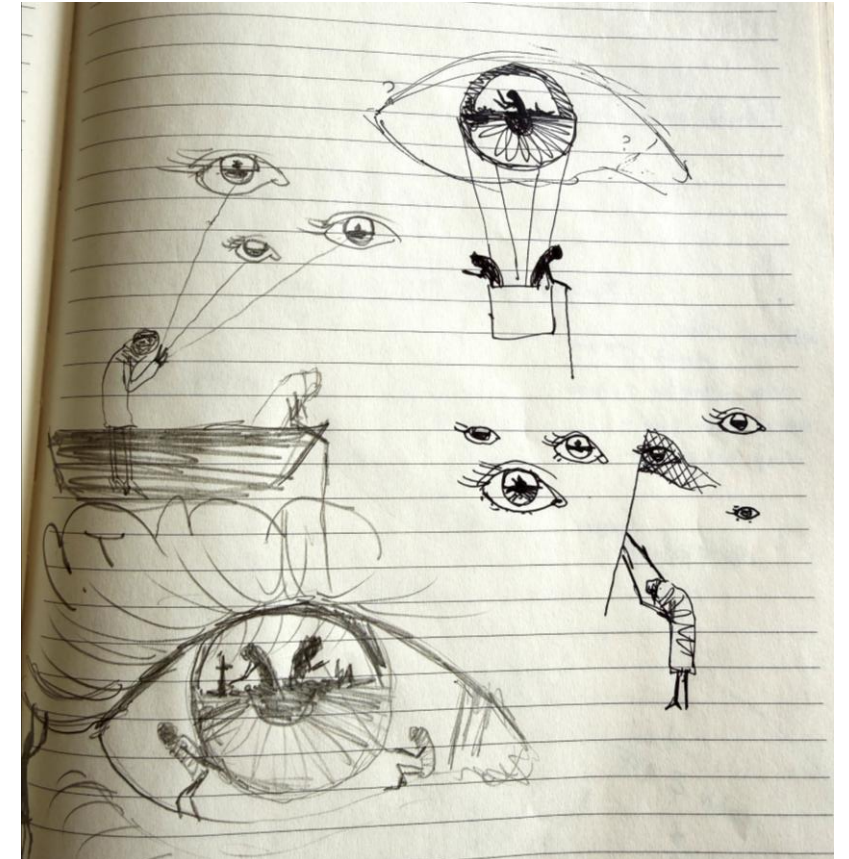
The Location

The Concept

- A large-scale river-themed storytelling mural using my signature eyes and imaginary characters reflecting the proximity of the Thames and the consultation feedback.
- The consultation will capture local folklore, and landmark people, places, events that should be included within the mural
- The colour palate will be inspired by the built and natural environment in the immediate vicinity of the wall
- This is a heavily tagged wall and the design accepts that this will continue, and works within these constraints
- The tags will form an ever-changing body of water on which the design floats reflecting the ebb and flow of time and tide
- This concept will be delivered in collaboration with street artist Phlegm whose work blends mythology and historical inspirations
