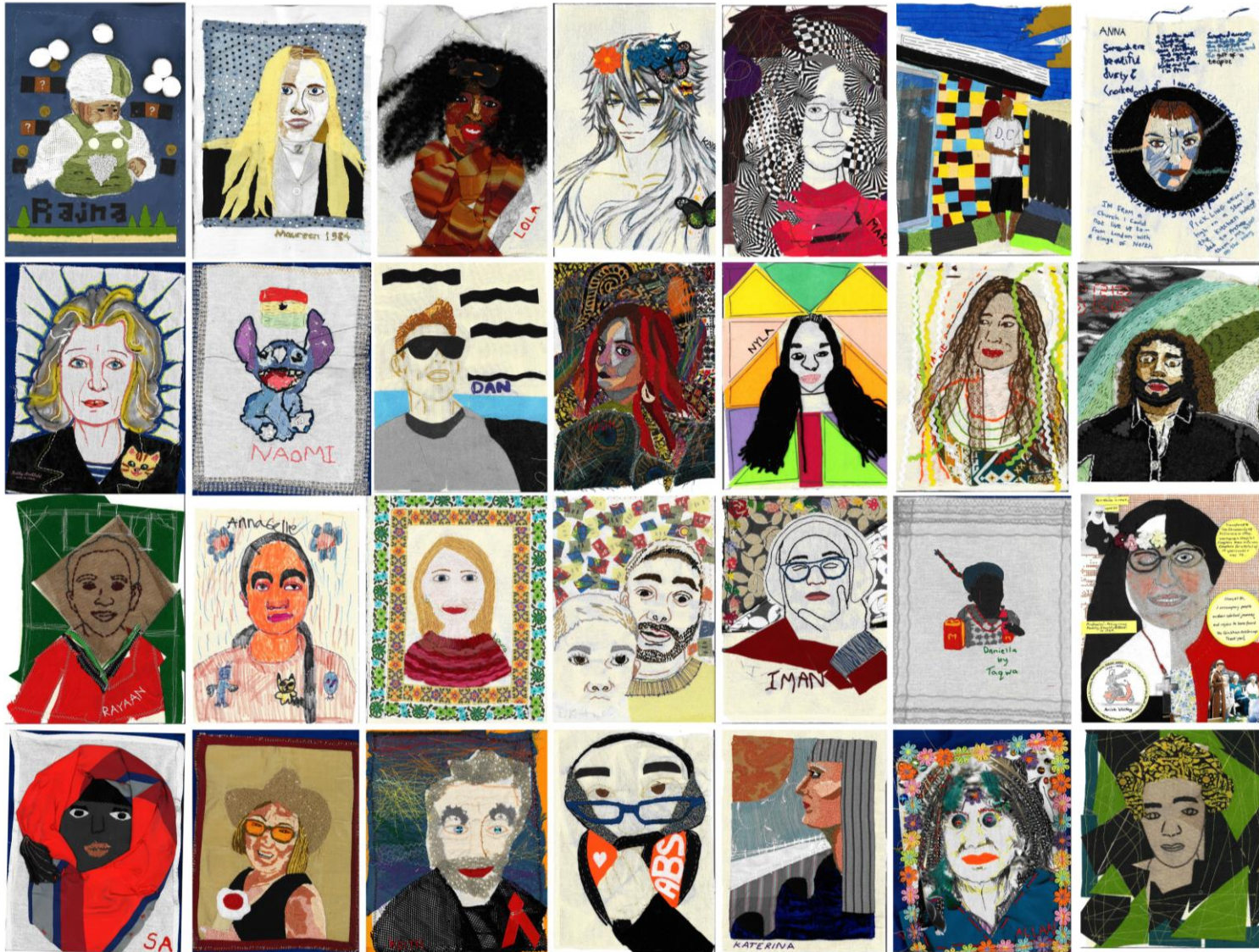

Inspired by a group visit to the Barbican's Unravel exhibition in 2024. We decided to make a community quilt to reflect our community.

We ran a series of summer intergenerational workshops introducing process, techniques and ways of making a portrait.

Workshops were open to all the community to join, 65 people attended the workshops including from the over 50s art group, staff, volunteers, children and young people joining the summer programmes and staff in the building. Over 80 people contributed to the making of this quilt. Youngest aged 7 and oldest aged 80!

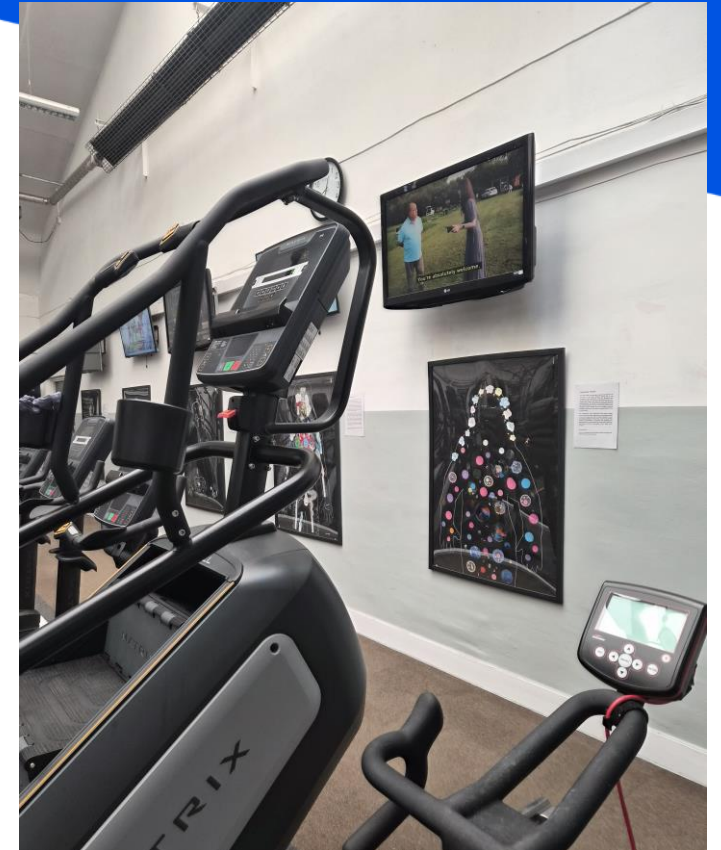
