What is the Community Resilience Network?

A pan-London initiative supporting organisations across all 32 boroughs and the City of London. It ensures community voices are at the heart of resilience efforts, with activities including developing emergency plans and training volunteers.



### **Why This Work Matters**

- Grenfell, COVID-19, burst water mains, heatwaves, and wildfires — lessons from recent crises.
- COVID-19 was one of the largest emergencies since World War II.
- Thames Water burst pipes caused borough-wide water outages.
- The 2022 heatwave caused record 207 wildfires; 2025 saw 117 wildfires, a 32% rise from 2024.
- Hate crimes are increasing, heightening vulnerabilities during


